

CAN YOU TAKE CARE OF YOUR **PET** IN AN **EMERGENCY?**



TIPS TO HELP SECURE YOUR PET'S SAFETY IN AN EMERGENCY



Use a microchip or collar ID with up-to-date contact information.



Put a pet rescue decal on the door or window so first responders know a pet may be inside.



Know where your pet hides when it's afraid, so you can evacuate faster.



Identify a pet-friendly place to stay, in case you have to leave home.



Carry a picture of your pet in the event of separation.



Take a pet carrier with you for the transport and safe-keeping of your pet.

UPDATE YOUR CHIP

Update your microchip's contact information at the manufacturer's website by locating the code number from the barcode sticker or microchip confirmation form provided by your veterinarian or animal shelter.

No code? Bring your pet to a veterinarian or shelter to have the microchip scanned and receive the information.

Enter your code at petmicrochiplookup.org to determine the manufacturer and update your information.

YOUR PET EMERGENCY GO-KIT SHOULD INCLUDE:



Basic first aid supplies



A 3-day supply of bottled water and the pet's preferred food, held in a waterproof container



Safety harness and leash



Waste clean-up supplies



Any medication and the pet's medical records



Contact list for veterinarians and local pet care organizations



List of your pet's feeding routine and any behavior issues



Comfort items, such as a blanket or favorite toy, to help keep your pet calm and comfortable
